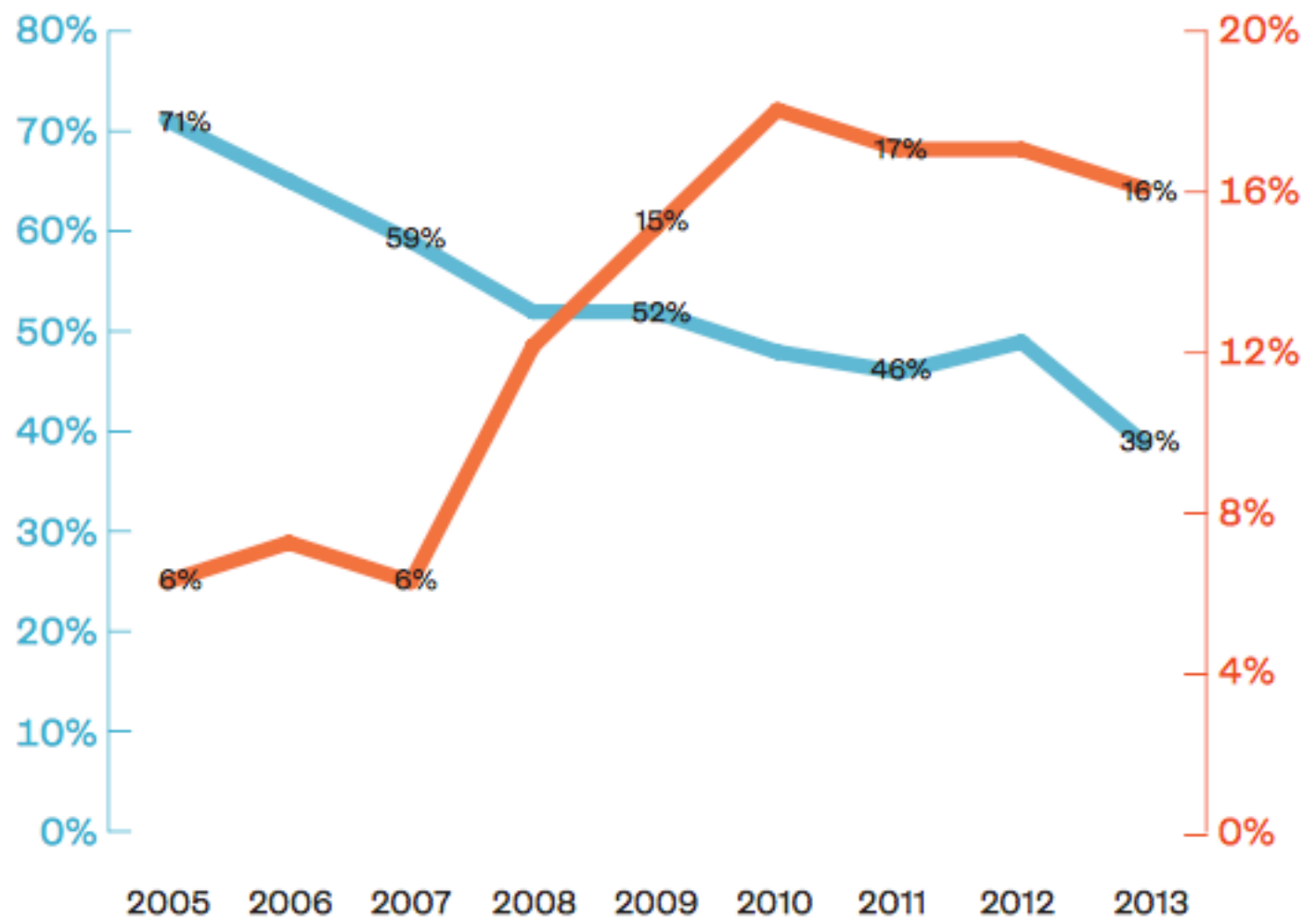

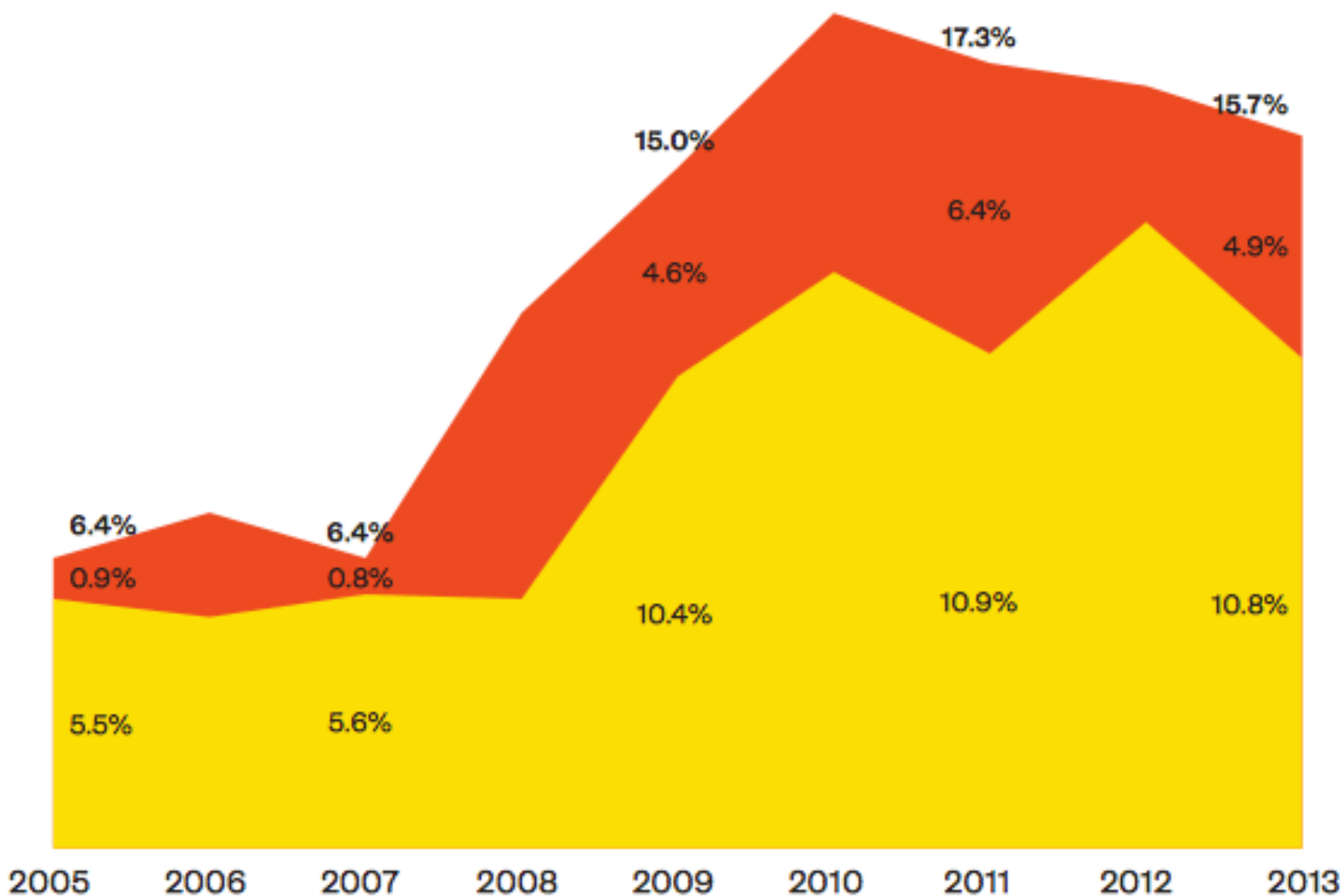

- ▨ Redevelopment zone

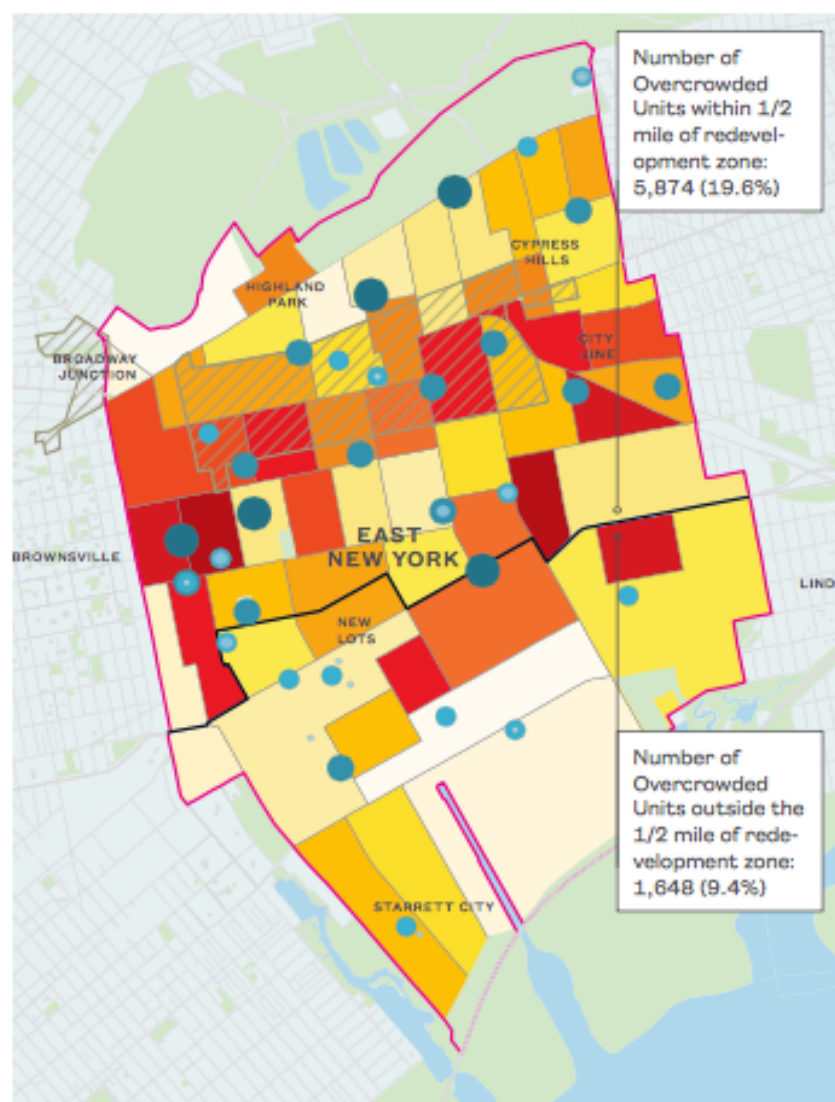
