# City School District 15 Brooklyn

Carroll Gardens, Park Slope, Sunset Park

## Key Findings

There are no family shelters located in the district, but more than 1,600 homeless students attend school in District 15, including 370 students living in shelter.

Students in shelter were chronically absent at roughly twice the rate of their doubled-up peers and nearly four times the rate of housed students.



Ratio of elementary students who will experience homelessness by fifth grade is an estimate based on trends over the last six years; due to growing student homelessness, this is likely an underestimate. Students who experienced homelessness in the last six years is the ratio of currently homeless and formerly homeless students to the total number of students in the district. Notes on educational outcomes are listed in each section. Percentages may not add to 100% due to rounding. Dotted lines and dashes indicate missing data or data that have been redacted due to accuracy or student privacy. "In Temporary Arrangement" refers to students who were homeless living in other temporary settings, not in shelter.
