



Student Homelessness Growing Fastest in Rural America

Most of America's homeless students live in cities and suburbs. However, roughly one in eight homeless students lives in a rural community. While student homelessness is primarily an urban problem, it is growing at a much faster rate in rural communities.

Student homelessness is on the rise nationwide...



Rural student homelessness grew 11% nationally, with growth in some states dramatically higher.



Rural student homelessness increased in 38 states.

In 26 states, it increased by more than the 11% rural growth rate.

In 14 states, it grew by more than twice the rural growth rate.

In Montana and Nebraska, that increase exceeded 100%.
