## Homeless Middle Schoolers Are 2x as Likely to Be Suspended as Their Classmates

Students who exprienced homelessness were suspended at almost $2 X$ the rate of housed students.


Homeless students account for $\mathbf{9 \%}$ of middle schoolers but $14 \%$ of middle school suspensions.

Homeless middle school students who are suspended are about 4 x more likely to drop out of school than their classmates who are not suspended.
...and over 3X as likely to transfer schools mid-year as housed students.

Those who were homeless were over $\mathbf{2 X}$ as likely to be chronically absent..

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When homeless students are able to attend school regularly, they are less likely to fall behind in their learning and more likely to perform at grade-level on annual exams.

Homeless students were half as likely to score proficient in math and English Language Arts, compared to housed students.
